Big Thought: As believers in climate change AND Jesus we must be able to articulate “the way, and the truth, and the life.” We have to meet people where they are, and use their relationship with Jesus, and their values, as the way to cut through the Climate Confusion.

Be It

1. The author notes that empowerment is often limited to “individual action” (changing your lightbulbs) and political action (marching in the street or signing petitions). However, there are efforts we can take at the “community level”. *What are tangible results and practical benefits you have seen or been a part of at the community level?*
2. In “Climate Confusion” three main factors are listed for the level of disinformation around climate change: money in politics; sowing doubt; and climate in the news. *How have you observed the Christian faith community responding to these influences? How could we respond in “grace and truth?”*
3. Oftentimes climate change conversations focus on the causes of the problem, however the author notes wide consensus in terms of taking action on moving to a 100 percent clean energy economy. *What are some reasons noted that extend beyond climate change in the 2018 report *Energy in the American Mind* found on page 51?*
4. One of the most important things we can do as people concerned about climate change is talk about it more. The author identifies a different way to approach the issue through: energy choice, energy freedom and national security. *What are some ways the Good News speaks to those values? What are some angles Christians can take to discuss climate change from a Kingdom perspective?*
